
PRAY FOR STARVING NORTH KOREANS


Hunger has always been a threat to North Korean families, but recent typhoons, flooding, and droughts have made food even more scarce. On top of that, the major COVID-19 outbreak last year caused a nationwide lockdown right in the middle of the rice farming season. To this day, North Koreans are feeling the effects as they continue to fall behind in rice production ... and many are now at risk of starving to death.

Pray for families to receive the food they desperately need to survive.

PRAY FOR CHRISTIANS IN LABOR CAMPS

Owning a Bible or sharing the Gospel is illegal in North Korea. If caught, a believer could be thrown into a labor camp where they are forced to work all day with little to no food. They are beaten and tortured for hours at a time. Still, they cling to their faith.

PRAY FOR UNDERGROUND CHURCHES

Believers in North Korea don't have the privilege of going to church with their families every Sunday. Instead, they must meet in secret inside each other's homes. North Korean authorities often monitor homes suspected of holding services and will raid them without warning.

Pray for the thousands of North Korean believers who are risking their lives by worshiping God and studying His Word.





PRAY FOR PEOPLE DISTRIBUTING BIBLES

Organizations like World Help have partners who are working nonstop to smuggle Bibles and food to persecuted Christians in North Korea. It's dangerous work. Even though they are extremely careful and have decades of experience, they are still taking a tremendous risk to help these believers.

Pray for their safety and for the details of their operations to remain secret so they can continue meeting the physical and spiritual needs of North Korean Christians.
