WEEK 1

PRAY FOR PEOPLE WHO DON'T HAVE WARM WINTER CLOTHING

Right now, there are people around the world who cannot afford warm clothing. Men, women, and children must face frigid weather without anything to keep them warm. Without winter essentials, they are vulnerable to health risks like hypothermia, frostbite, and more. *Pray that God will provide these families with warm clothing to help them get through the coldest months.*

WEEK 2

PRAY FOR FAMILIES WITHOUT ADEQUATE HOUSING

Many families living in poverty or who have been displaced by war don't have shelter that keeps them protected from the cold or generators to provide heat. Some families in places like Afghanistan burn plastics to keep warm, but this causes the home to fill with toxic fumes. Without a way to stay warm, families are in hopeless situations. *Pray for the protection of struggling people who need a safe, warm place to shelter this winter.*

WEEK 3

PRAY FOR PERSECUTED CHRISTIANS DURING THE HOLIDAYS

For Christians, one of the most special things about winter is Christmas, where we celebrate Jesus's birth. But Christ-followers living in countries around the world that are closed or hostile to the Gospel don't get to go to a Christmas Eve service or sing Christmas songs. *Please pray for persecuted Christians worldwide who are celebrating Christmas in secret this year.*

WEEK 4

PRAY FOR PEOPLE WHO DON'T HAVE ENOUGH FOOD

For people living in poverty, food is a constant need, but it can become even harder to find during the winter months. Food shortages often get worse in winter, which means food gets even more expensive for people who were already struggling. *Pray that men, women, and children receive nutritious meals during the winter and all year long.*
